INJUNCTION MAY CHECK PAVING

Although the city council ordered the improvement of West Eleventh street by paving at the last regular session of the council it failed to dispose of the matter. Now a number of property owners are threatening injunction proceedings if the city prepares to go ahead with the work, claiming that a majority of the property owners on the street do not desire the improvement.

When the petition for paving came in it was accompanied by a protest. Neither petition had a majority of the property fronting on the street, many property owners refusing to sign one way or the other. The council acted on the matter ordering the street paved.

The council split on the question, Summerville, Millar and Campbell voting aye, Emerick and Mitchell no.

POISON FARM DEATHS RIDICULED BY FARMERS. CARLYLE, Ill., July 19.—Residents of this town ridiculed today the reports of the recent mysterious Ackerman deaths on the so-called "poison farm" near Mount Vernon.

Investigation today revealed that Joseph Ackerman, reported to have died last evening, never existed. John Ackerman died two weeks ago. The farm is now deserted.

That no protests having been filed against the improvement of South Newtown street from West Eleventh street to Dakota avenue, due notice of the intention of the Council to cause said improvement to be made, having been given, said improvement having been ordered made, the Council has considered the matter and, herewith, ascertains the probable cost of making such improvement to be the sum of \$9329.42.

And said Council further finds that the special and peculiar benefit accruing upon each lot or part thereof adjacent to said improvement and in proportion to benefits, to be the respective amounts hereinafter set opposite the number or description of each lot or part thereof, and such amounts respectively are hereby declared to be the proportionate share of each lot or part thereof, the cost of such improvement and is hereby declared to be assessed against said lot or parcels respectively, the name appearing above each description, being the name of the owner, or reputed owner, of each such lot or part thereof.

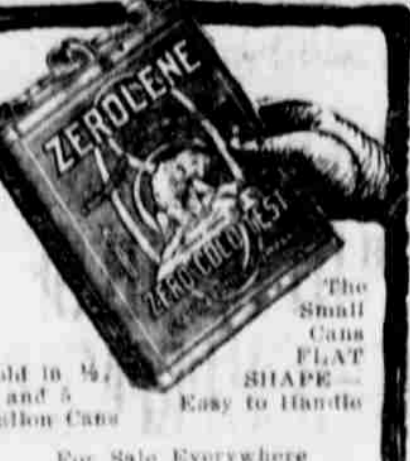
