RELIEF SENT TO CLODBURST VICTIMS

RENO, Nev., July 19.—Relief expeditions were today rushed to Mazuma and Seven Troughs, Nev., which were devastated by a cloudburst which cost the lives of twenty persons. Fully 150 more, it is said, are still missing today, and the property damage is enormous.

The cloudburst struck both mining camps without an instant's warning, sweeping buildings away in the torrent and hurling great rocks down the hillsides. Many miners are believed to be trapped in tunnels and shafts.

It is feared that many were killed beside the 20 bodies recovered, as other bodies were seen struggling or floating in the water.

The big hotel at Mazuma, the largest structure in the town, was overturned and several were killed in its wreck.

The relief expeditions were badly handicapped by the impassable roads, filled with timbers, boulders and uprooted trees, and many could not reach the scene. Help was despatched to doctors and nurses on horseback.

Judge Lindsey's recent re-election to office by a large majority, and his again giving the credit of the victory to the women, proves that the good women are being less and less deceived by the false-tongued and falser-brained politicians.

What brazen affrontory for anti-suffragists to lift a few of Judge Lindsey's words from their original setting and try to give them a false coloring.

People throughout the nation have not only read Judge Lindsey's writings but many have heard him lecture, especially here in the northwest and on the Pacific coast.

The good men plus the good women have made a Judge Lindsey possible in Denver, just as the good men plus the good women made a Mayor Cotterill possible in Seattle, and just as they will some day not far distant make a Bryan president possible. 115 WORDS A MINUTE NEW TYPEWRITER RECORD

SPOKANE, Wn., July 19.—Miss Florence E. Wilson of New York today is the holder of the world's typewriter speed record for one hour's continuous writing on unfamiliar copy. Competing in the contests held under the auspices of the National Commercial Teachers' Federation, Miss Wilson wrote 7,219 words in the hour with 68 errors. Deducing five words for each error this gave her a net score of 6,879, or an average of 115 words a minute.

NEW HOMESTEAD LAW GOES INTO EFFECT

WASHINGTON, July 19.—Secretary of the Interior Walter Fisher today began the enforcement of the new homestead law which reduces the area of required cultivation where entrymen need relief. The required residence period also is reduced to three years.

ORDINANCE NO. 600.

An Ordinance declaring the cost of the improvement by paving on South Ivy street from Eighth street to north line of south Park Addition and assessing the property benefited thereby, and declaring such assessment, and directing the entry thereof in the Docket of City Liens.

The City of Medford Doth Ordain as follows:

Section 1.
