FURTHER EVIDENCE IN BEAR CREEK CASE

The fate of the Bear creek bridge again hangs in the balance for a week, when it will become known whether the city or Messrs. Bowers and Carlton will appeal the case to the higher courts.

Friday the arguments advanced at the first hearing, which was held in Portland last June, with additional evidence, were advanced before Judge Calkins of Ashland. The hearing went even more into detail and every additional scrap of evidence that could be found was introduced by City Attorney Porter J. Neff. Judge Calkins promises a decision within a week.

Before handing down his decision Judge Calkins may make a trip to Salem to consult other law authorities in the state library.

ORDINANCE NO. 670.

An Ordinance assessing the property adjacent to and benefited by the 6-inch lateral sewer constructed on Laurel street from Eleventh street to Thirteenth street for the cost of constructing the same and providing the manner of carrying said assessment into full effect.

The City of Medford Doth Ordain as follows:

Section 1. Whereas, the City Council did heretofore provide by Ordinance for the serving of the owners of property adjacent to and benefited by the construction of the lateral sewer hereinafter described to appear before said council and show cause, if any, why said property should not be assessed for the construction of said sewer, and did fix a time for hearing any such protests, which notice was given in accordance with said Ordinance more than ten days before the beginning of the construction of said sewer, but no protests against said construction or assessment of the cost thereof was made by anyone and said sewer was, by said council, ordered constructed.

And Whereas, the cost of the construction of said sewer has been and hereby is determined to be the sum of \$678.00.

Now Therefore, said City doth ordain and declare that each parcel of property described below is adjacent to and benefited by that certain lateral sewer 6 inches in size, constructed on south Laurel street from Eleventh street to Thirteenth street and that the proportion of the cost of said sewer which each of said parcels of land should bear, based on the benefits derived respectively by said several tracts of land, is the amount set opposite the description of each parcel below, and that each of said parcels is actually benefited in the amount set opposite its description below by the construction of said sewer and that said several amounts represent the proportional benefits of said several parcels from said sewer.

And each of said parcels is hereby assessed the amount set opposite its description below for the construction of said sewer. The name appearing above each description being the name of the owner, or reputed owner of each such lot or parcel.

Assessment for a 6-inch sewer on Laurel street from Eleventh street to Thirteenth street.
