

BULL MOOSE PARTY IN THIS COUNTY TO BE LAUNCHED SOON

The National Progressive party will be formally launched in Jackson county at a meeting to be held at the Hotel Medford Tuesday evening, July 23, at which time delegates will be selected for the state meeting to be held at Portland, Thursday, July 25, when five delegates will be chosen to attend the national convention to be held at Chicago, August 5.

The call for the meeting to be held Tuesday evening was issued by A. K. Ware, president, and George E. Boos, secretary, of the Roosevelt club. All voters irrespective of their former party affiliations are invited to take an active interest in the formation of the new party in Jackson county.

WILL TRY NEW TYPE PAVING

The city council at a special meeting this afternoon decided to try out a new type of pavement on Myrtle street on the east side, an oil macadam offered by Schell & Schell contractors.

The new type of pavement is said to be satisfactory for streets on which there is light traffic and is much cheaper than the pavement which has been used in the past in this city. The contractors offer to lay it for \$1.10 a square yard. This is 40 cents a square yard cheaper than the light pavement which has been laid in the city.

The council passed an ordinance requiring each property owner in the city residing on a paved street to grade and park the strip between the sidewalk and the curb.

Councilman Millar attempted to re-open the Eleventh street paving question again by moving, for a reconsideration but failed to find a second for the motion. Property owners on that street threaten injunction proceedings against the city to keep it from paving that street.

JUDGES NAMED FOR MADE IN MEDFORD DESIGN

UPWARD MOVEMENT ON STOCK EXCHANGE

NEW YORK, July 22.—Within thirty minutes of an uneven opening today's stock market developed a general upward movement and many leaders including Reading, Union Pacific, Amalgamated Copper and Erie made fractional advances. Tobacco issues made advances of from market eased off and trading dwindled to almost nothing.

NORMAL RAINFALL FOR JULY EXCEEDED

Thunder showers which reached a climax Saturday when .2 of an inch of rain fell in Medford has caused a drop in the temperature which ranged high in the valley last week. The maximum Sunday was 74.5 with a relative humidity of 42 per cent. The .2 precipitation is 1-100th above normal for July. The prediction for Tuesday is fair and warmer.

JAP COMMISSIONERS VISIT PANAMA FAIR

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., July 22.—S. Yamayaka and Y. Jayitima commissioners to the Panama Pacific exposition on behalf of the Japanese government, which has promised a magnificent display at the 1915 fair, were given a splendid reception upon their arrival here on the liner Shinyo Maru by city, exposition and military officials.

Headed by a troop of cavalry and a mounted band from the Presidio and a platoon of police, the cavalcade which accompanied the distinguished visitors went to the Fairmont Hotel, where the commissioners will make their headquarters while in the city.

DRIVE FROM LAKE IN 5 HOURS 40 MIN.

It is now possible to drive autos to the rim of Crater Lake according to Robert A. Flynn and Jack Morrill who returned Sunday evening from a trip to Klamath Falls returning by way of the lake. They nearly lowered the record for time between the lake and Medford making the distance in five hours and 40 minutes in Morrill's Locomobile.

"We drove within a half mile of the rim," states Mr. Flynn, and men are rapidly getting the remainder of the road in condition. I am certain machines reached the rim today without trouble.

"The accommodations at the rim are first-class and the season is open in earnest. A large number of people are already at the lake."

EXCISE TAX BILL TO BE PASSED BY SENATE

WASHINGTON, July 22.—Leaders who have made a canvass of the senate today predicted the passing of the Democratic excise tax bill. The bill comes to a vote in the senate on Friday, having already passed the house.

The bill practically extends the provisions of the corporation tax to all persons and co-partnerships "doing an annual business of more than \$5000."

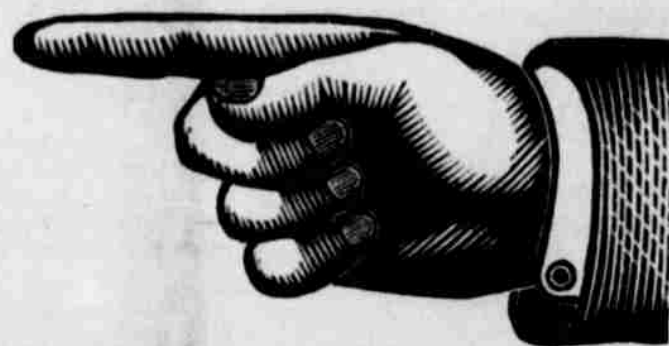
