

The city council at a special meeting this afternoon decided to try out a new type of payment on Myrtle street on the cast side, an oil macadem offered by Schell & Schell contractors.

The new type of pavement is said to be satisfactory for streets on which there is light traffic and is much cheaper than the pavement which has been used in the past in this city. The contractors offer to lay it for \$1.10 a square yard. This is 40 cents a square yard cheaper than the light pavement which has been laid in the city.

The council passed an ordinance requiring each property - owner in the city residing on a paved street to grade and park the strip between the sidewalk and the curb.

Councilman Millar attempted to re-open the Eleventh street paving question again by moving, for a reconsideration but failed to find a second for the motion. Property owners on that street threaten injunction proceedings against the city to keep it from paving that street.






