

PORTLAND, Ore., July 25.-It i believed today that should Senator Jonathan Bourne Jr., of Oregon, hecome a candidate for re-election if will be upon an independent ticket without renouncing his allegiance to the republican party, and avoiding as far as possible any mention of issues set forth in the republican national platform as adopted by the Chicago convention. No mention of the senator's name was made at the state progressive party convention today, nor was the possibility of his becoming a candidate discussed outside of the convention hall by those in attendance.


