TRYING TO CHECK BUGGY PEDDLING

The Spaulding Company of Ohio two years ago peddled hacks and buggies in Jackson county without obtaining license so to do as required by the Oregon law. When prosecutions were initiated before service of warrant their agents left for distant fields. This summer again the peddling began and warrants were issued for the arrest of two of their agents, based on sales made to Applegate farmers. Again it was found that the company had transferred its base of operations to Marion county where arrests were made for peddling without license. On the 22nd of July R. R. Dunniway, a Portland attorney, secured from the circuit court of Marion county an injunction order temporarily restraining the prosecuting attorney of the third district and the first district from instituting proceedings against the Spaulding company for alleged peddling. The motion to dissolve the injunction will be argued before Judge Galloway next Wednesday, the date being represented by John A. McNany of Salem and B. F. Mulkey of Medford.
