CRATER LAKE BEST ATTRACTION SEEN 60,000 MILE TRIP

Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Henderson and son Charles arrived in the city by automobile Wednesday evening by way of eastern Oregon and Crater Lake from St. Paul, Minn., and left this morning for Ban Francisco. They expect to motor eastward to their home by way of Salt Lake City. Crater Lake was the western destination and they declare that they were more than repaid for their long trip overland by one glimpse of the lake.

"We are thorough believers in the "See America First" theory as evolved by James J. Hill," states Mr. Henderson, "and we have motored to all of the great scenic attractions of the United States. Two years ago we traveled eastward to Niagara Falls and other eastern scenic attractions journeying down the Hudson which is a wonderful automobile trip. Last year we mojored through Yellowstone and to the Grand Canyon of the Colorado. We have traveled nearly 60,000 miles in the United States by automobile and are traveling over six months each year.

"This year we decided to tour the northwest and visit Crater Lake and we feel more than repaid for the trip. The lake is the most beautiful single bit of scenery in the United States and I believe this after seeing many more noted attractions. The trip down Rogue River is a wonderful drive. Some day thousands of machines will travel over that road annually for it is really worth while. "We have never been in Yosemite
