MISSOURI PRIMARY HAS FIVE TICKETS IN FIELD. JEFFERSON CITY, Mo., Aug. 3.—A statewide primary will be held in Missouri next Tuesday to determine whom the respective parties will put upon the November ballots for state, judicial, congressional and county offices. Five parties have filed nominations for the primary ballot, the democrats and republicans have full tickets, but the socialists, socialist laborites and prohibitionists have some vacancies.
