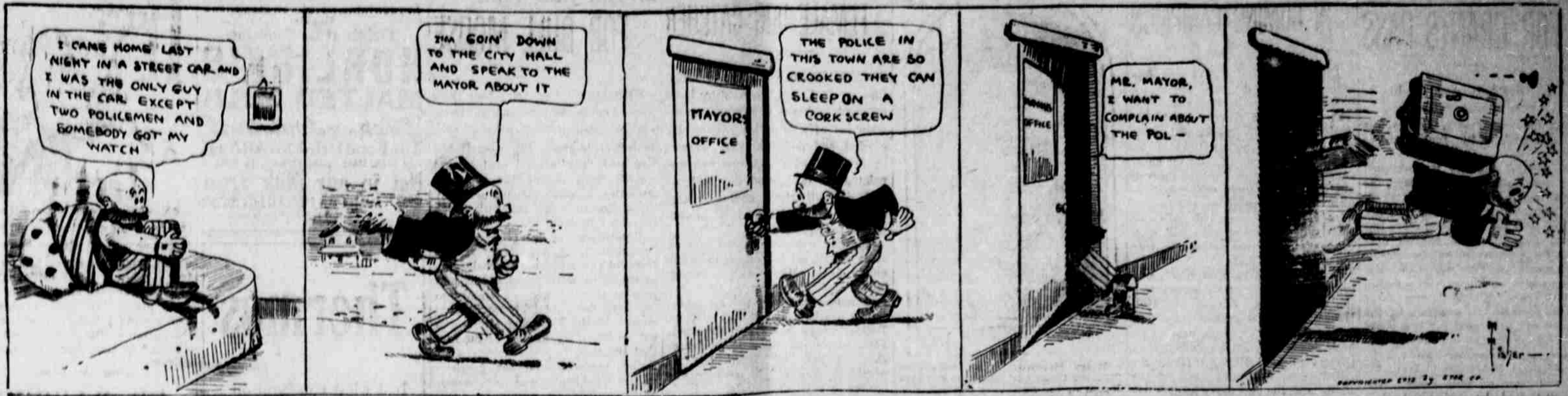

FRUIT MARKET IN NEW YORK

Spohel & Day issue the following report of New York, July 30: Monday 37 cars, and today 25 cars auctioned here. Bartlett: About 19000 boxes yesterday and today naturally caused a drop in prices, the pears still remaining very green. The best sold today at \$2.25 to \$2.00 and the others at \$1.75 to \$2.00. The first car from Suisun yesterday showed poorish quality and immature, and sold at \$1.50 to \$1.80. Average of all the Bartletts today here \$2.00, is considerably above all other markets. Don't forget, the Bartlett is the most favorite fruit that comes here from your coast. Peaches: 115 cars yesterday and \$2 cars today from Georgia, including a few from Arkansas; \$1.00 to \$1.50 per carrier on the Georgias which are from the northern part of that state.
