NAT GOODWIN HURT WHEN BOAT IS UPSET

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Aug. 16.—Suffering from internal injuries so severe that an operation may be necessary to save his life, Nat Goodwin, actor and marital expert, lies today in a critical condition at his home at Santa Monica. He was caught beneath a heavy skiff that overturned in the surf at Rocky Point, forty miles north of Santa Monica, and battered into unconsciousness. Goodwin and Miss Marjorie Morland, leading woman in his last New York company and to whom it has been reported many times that the actor is engaged, were enroute up the coast to inspect a piece of beach property when Goodwin and the captain of the launch attempted to row ashore. Goodwin was taken to Santa Monica, where it was stated the extent of his injuries could not at once be determined.
