GENERAL BOOTH, SALVATION ARMY LEADER, DIES, AGED 83

LONDON, Aug. 21.—General William Booth, commander in chief of the Salvation Army died at 10:30 o'clock tonight. He was born at Nottingham in 1829. He was unconscious for 48 hours before his death.

The bulletins had not revealed the seriousness of the general's condition which it is admitted has been hopeless for a week. He recently underwent an operation for the removal of a cataract of the left eye. Septic poisoning resulted and his health declined.

Public interest now centers in the successor to the last commander. Under the constitution the Salvation Army general nominates his successor and this General Booth did several years ago placing the name in a sealed envelope which was deposited with the army's lawyers with instructions not to be opened until after his death. It is the belief that the name will prove to be that of Bramwell Booth, who for thirty years has been his chief of staff.

While English members of the Salvation Army are convinced General Booth is deserving of burial in Westminster Abbey it is not expected the Abbey authorities will award him this honor.

BATTLE INSURGENTS CHINESE REBELION

SHANGHAI, Aug. 21.—Dispatches received here today from Hankow confirm the reports of desperate fighting near Wu Chang. The cause of the outbreak is not definitely known here but it is supposed to be a direct result of Dr. Sun Yat Sen's break with President Yuan Shi Kai, and probably marks the resumption of the revolution in China.

Wu Chang adjoins Hankow, and foreign residents there are greatly alarmed over the situation.

The natives of Southern China are demanding a separate republic with either Dr. Sun Yat Sen or Li Yuan Hung as president.

RECORD STEELHEAD CATCH FIFTY-ONE TROUT TAKEN

The record catch of steelhead trout, the largest number ever brought into the city from a fishing expedition to the Rogue River was brought in Sunday by Marion Lance, Owen Dunlap and Nate Biden, consisting of 51 steelhead trout weighing from 3 to 9 pounds each.

The party left Medford Thursday afternoon, returning Sunday noon. All the fish except one was taken on the Backus fly, and most of them were caught Friday and Saturday, eight only being taken Sunday morning.

then by analysis of the death of nations showed that this condition had always and must always arise out of the taxing of good citizens on their industry and personal property, to support the machinery of government which always is used for personal profit of the bad and indolent. He drew a picture of the kingdom of heaven, with all the salutes taxed to the limit on their mansions, robes and harps, creating a fund to maintain the police department in hell, and showed that this was really what the state of Oregon was doing.

He further illustrated this by a parable of a man who inherited a vast estate and turned it over to a steward who gave the wealth away and then taxed the heir on his labor to build roads for the benefit of the grantees of his own wealth. This condition had builded all the great estates and fortunes, so that as we are now the very bounties of God had become a curse to the people as voiced in the idea of over-production.

This condition made it necessary to radically change the entire tax laws of the state so that the state shall support itself out of the revenues it now creates and gives away in franchisees, rights of way, timber lands, water powers, minerals, privileges and land instead of as now by grinding the face off the poor.
