CUTHBERT TO BUILD MAUSOLEUM AT SALEM

George F. Cuthbert, formerly a furniture dealer at Medford, now manager of the Portland Mausoleum company, has completed arrangements to build a mausoleum at Salem that will contain 1000 tombs. It will be similar to about 140 other sanitary community mausoleums erected under the W. I. Hood patents in various cities throughout the United States.

The site has been selected on top of the hill in City View cemetery overlooking the valley for miles in every direction, and commanding a splendid view of the city of Salem. The Salem mausoleum will represent a total investment of \$100,000 to \$200,000. It will have a fund in the hands of trustees for its preservation for all time. The building will be re-enforced concrete and stone. The interior will be of marble.
