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BOYS WILL BE BACK HUNGRY
FT. STEVENES, Ore., Aug. 28.—Of the eight companies of Coast Artillery Oregon Reserves now in camp at the fortifications commanding the entrance to the Columbia River, the 7th alone possess men with "tin stomachs."

SCHOOLS WILL OPEN IN MEDFORD NEXT MONDAY
Prof. E. S. Collins has made public the following:
1. School will open Monday, Sept. 2, for enrollment, classification, etc.

2. General teacher's meeting in the High school building Saturday, August 31, at 2 p. m.
3. A meeting of the High School and Special teachers Friday, August 30 at 2 p. m.

4. Children who will be 6 years old on or before January 1, 1913, may enter school next Monday morning.
5. Boundaries of Ward schools: Owing to the fact that the Washington school is centrally located, and all pupils of the city south of Main street to Bear creek must be enrolled there, it makes it impossible to accommodate many living north of Main street, near the Washington school.

The division has been made after much deliberation, and we hope, until buildings are erected on the new school sites, that the following will meet approval:
(a) Washington School boundaries: South of Main street to district limits, and east of Bear creek. Also, north of Main street to Fourth street, thence to Holly street.

(b) Lincoln School boundaries: East of Holly street to Bear creek, all lying north of Main.
(c) Jackson School boundaries: North of Fourth street and east to Holly street.

Note—All pupils up to the 8th grade, in this division, enroll in Jackson school, as seven rooms will be maintained there to accommodate the overflow of the Washington school.
(d) Roosevelt school boundaries: All of district 49, east of Bear creek.

Note—This school will maintain five grades. All pupils above the 5th grade, south of Main, go to the Washington school. All pupils north of Main go to the Lincoln school.
6. Mr. Bowman, principal of the High school, will be in his office every afternoon of this week. Students wishing to register, or talk over High school work, are requested to meet him, if possible, this week.

7. The principals of the Ward schools will be in the office of their respective buildings all day Friday, for interview in regard to school work, registration, etc.
8. The Oregon State Fair will open on the 2nd, and close on the 7th of September. None of our teachers will be able to attend, as school will be in session. We have sent an exhibit from the domestic science, art and manual training departments, and I take this means of soliciting some one to look after the exhibit for our schools. Please call me by phone, if you contemplate attending the fair.

DENIED DAUGHTER, MURDERS MOTHER

HAGERSTOWN, Md., Aug. 28.—Confronted here today by his sweetheart, Miss Ulah Henry, Norman McCleary, aged 23 years, broke down and confessed to strangling the girl's mother, Mrs. Nannie Henry, to death and stealing \$40 from the victim, going to Washington to seek the girl.

Mrs. Henry, McCleary told the police, objected to his attentions to her daughter and warned him to stay away from the house. Recently Mrs. Henry sent her daughter to Washington to visit relatives. On August 13 McCleary demanded the mother to give him her daughter's address. When this was refused, McCleary waited until night when he returned and reiterated his demand. Again refused, he choked the woman to death and finding the address in the house started for Washington, where he was arrested on suspicion.

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PROHIBITION CAMPAIGN FROM AUTOMOBILE

A novel method of campaigning is that being followed by B. Lee Paget, prohibition candidate for United States senator and O. A. Stillman, candidate for congress, who will speak here Friday night.

Messrs. Paget and Stillman are making an automobile tour of the principal towns in every county in the state. They have already visited 90 towns in Washington, Yamhill, Clackamas, Hood River, Marion, Polk, Benton, Linn and Lane counties. Their "water wagon" as the automobile has come to be known has taken Messrs. Paget and Stillman to lumber mills, factories and to farmers and threshing crews in the fields. In all of these places they have received a thoughtful hearing.

Mr. Paget is a well known citizen of Portland, who has been identified with all the movements for the betterment of the community. He is treasurer of the People's Power League and a member of the state grange.

STILL SEARCHING AT LAKE FOR BAKOWSKI'S REMAINS
Although B. B. Bakowski disappeared in Crater Lake Park in February, 1911, and no trace of him has ever been found, hope of finding his remains has not been abandoned.

Cleo, Clark, W. Frank Arant, superintendent and Harry Momyer, head ranger of the Crater Lake National Park, spent a day recently searching for traces of the missing man. They spent some time in making perilous climbs around the inside of the rim of the crater although all they could hope to find were the bleached traces of Bakowski.

EIGHT INDICTMENTS BY GRAND JURY

Eight indictments were returned by the grand jury Tuesday afternoon and service will be made on the men not yet in custody as rapidly as they can be located. The indictments, for the most part, followed preliminary hearings in the different justice courts over the county. Trial will follow in most of the cases at an early date.

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STATE TICKETS FOR MICHIGAN

DETROIT, Mich., Aug. 28.—In complete returns from the state primary election received today show that Amos Musselman has been nominated for governor by the republicans; Woodridge Ferris by the democrats, and L. W. Watkins by the progressives.

The returns are coming in very slowly. Less than one-third the voters of Michigan cast their ballots. The progressives' vote was small.

The returns from 33 counties give Musselman a plurality over Martindale of 4,000 votes.

Eight of the seventeen aldermen accused of grafting have been renominated.
