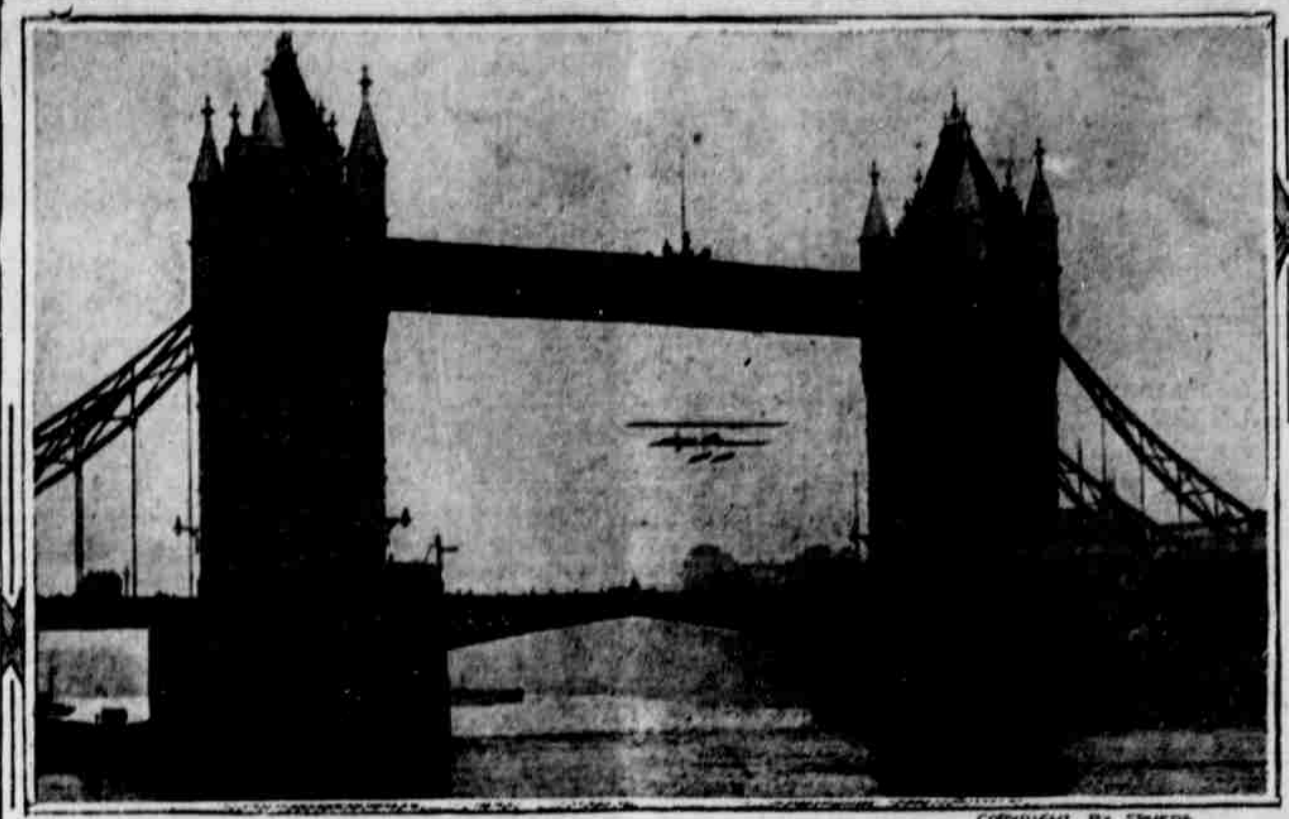

Davis, was one of the happiest inmates in the Nebraska penitentiary today. Prince was to have been hanged tomorrow, but an appeal to the supreme court has acted as a stay of execution and he is assured of at least six months more of life. His crime was committed last February and marked the beginning of a series of tragedies at the state penitentiary, in which four officials and three convicts were killed.
