OUR SUPERMAN

ALL democrats are traitors." So proclaimed Theodore Roosevelt in 1900 after being nominated by the bosses for vice-president.

"If Mr. Taft is not elected, a period of industrial chaos to business and bad times will result, in which the workman will suffer more than any other class.

So wrote President Roosevelt in 1908 after he had used the steam roller to force the nomination of Taft.

The letter was a characteristic appeal to charlatanism in his effort to elect W. H. Taft president, a demagogic attack upon Bryan for preaching those very principles that the Bull Moose is now ranting for.

"Any man claiming to be a progressive who does not support the progressive party is merely the ally and tool of the reactionaries."

So shouts Theodore Roosevelt in his frantic effort to secure a third term in 1912, self-nominated by a party of his own creation, for which he has appropriated most of Bryan's principles and many of Debs' planks.

In brief, throughout his entire career, those opposing Roosevelt are liars, traitors, undesirable citizens, allies and tools of reactionaries, malefactors of wealth.

Had Mr. Roosevelt ever originated any progressive policies, had he used his two terms to advance progressive measures, had he with the power and prestige of his office forced the "humanitarian" program he has borrowed from the socialists, he might have done for humanity what Lloyd George is doing in England.

If Roosevelt is sincere, it can only be because he takes himself seriously as a superman, above and beyond the law.

Whatever he does is right—it cannot be questioned. The end always justifies the means, his use hallows mere ukase settles all problems that vex humanity.

He ranks with the Caesars and Napoleons in his own mind as a Broddingnagian striding through a Liliputian world.

That he is regarded as a superman by his followers is also evident. On no other ground can his adoration be accounted for.

"The Hymn of Armageddon," by George Sylvester Vierrick, in the International, a typical Roosevelt anthem, shows clearly the adoration of the hero-worshippers for their superman.

The sternest militant of God whose trumpet in the fray Has cleft the city into three shall lead us on this day.

The holy strength that David had is his, the faith that saves, For he shall free the toilers as Abe Lincoln freed the slaves.

For he shall move the mountains that groan with ancient sham, And mete with equal measure to the lion and the lamb.

And he shall wipe away the tears that burn on woman's cheek, For in the nation's council hence the mothers, too, shall speak.

Through him the rose of peace shall blow from the red rose of strife, America shall write his name into the Book of Life.

And where at Armageddon we battle with the sword Shall rise the mystic commonwealth, the City of the Lord!

NEW YORK, Sept. 10.—Campaign receipts and expenses of the progressives as announced here today show that the 600 odd contributors were mostly women who gave sums ranging from \$1 upward.

The statement covers a period from July 1 to the present and of the \$55,199 received in contributions George W. Perkins and Frank A. Munsey each gave \$15,000.

The names of Gifford Pinchot, Medill McCormick and Roosevelt do not appear on the list of givers.

Other large contributions received were: George Moore, \$5,000; Mrs. W. Dudley Foulke, \$500; George A. Soden, William Wrigley, Junior, Chicago and George E. Roosevelt, \$1,000 each; Mrs. Antoinette Wood, New York, \$5,000; Mrs. Leigh Hunt, Mrs. Emmaline Roosevelt, \$500 each; Mrs. Emily Sarew, \$300, and George E. Potter, Chicago, \$1200.

The total expenditures were \$51,000.

NOGALES, Ariz., Sept. 10.—Fulfilling a threat to prevent the operation of trains on the Southern Pacific line south of Nogales, Mexican rebels marooned the first train sent over the line in three weeks.

Refugees arriving here today reported that eight Mexican federal soldiers and one Indian were killed Sunday when Yaqui Indians attacked Empalme, Sonora. The attack was repulsed.

GAYNOR LOSES TEMPER DURING POLICE PROBE

NEW YORK, Sept. 10.—Mayor Gaynor of New York proved a refractory witness when called this afternoon to testify at the Aldermanic probe into alleged corruption of New York police.

"If I am not allowed to give the facts in my own way and as I know them I will quit the stand at once."

After considerable difficulty the mayor was mollified and continued his testimony. He said that he kept track of the operations of the police department by letters and written reports from Police Commissioner Waldo.

Mayor Gaynor again lost his temper when he was questioned at length regarding the part he played in directing the police force. When asked if he looked after the department and knew what was going on, Gaynor fairly shook.

"I have eyes, ears, hands and feet," he angrily shouted. "And I use them all."

The climax came when one of the investigators asked him if he did not think the present system of conducting the police force was defective.

"I did not come here to think. I came here to give facts. I am willing to give all the facts in my possession, but I don't want to be bothered or pestered. I don't know what I have got to do with this thing, anyway."

Federals Granted Permit to Cross WASHINGTON, Sept. 10.—Authority to permit 1500 Mexican federalists to come into El Paso from Juarez and then to entrain for some point in Arizona, not disclosed, so that they may cross into Sonora state for a concerted attack on the rebel forces, was wired from Washington this afternoon to American officers along the Mexican border.

The Mexican troops will travel on Southern Pacific trains.
