EAGLE POINTERS BACK GOV. WEST

Resolutions commending Governor West's stand in regard to the enforcement of the anti-vice laws of the state and his "clean-up" campaign were adopted Sunday by the Baptist church of Eagle Point. The resolutions are said to express the views of a large majority of the citizens of Eagle Point. They follow: "Be it resolved, by the congregation of the Baptist church in Eagle Point, Oregon, assembled for the worship of God on the morning of September 8, 1912: "First, that we extend to Governor Oswald West our unqualified endorsements of his efforts for the enforcement of the laws of this commonwealth and for the moral and civic betterment of our state. "Second, that we pledge to Governor West our undivided support as a body of Christian citizens. "Third, that a copy of these resolutions be sent to Governor West and given to the press for publication."

MORAL CRUSADE SWEEPS DENVER

DENVER, Colo., Sept. 11.—Indictments charging violation of their oaths of office by permitting vice to flourish in Denver were returned today against Mayor Arnold, Chief of Police O'Neil and Police Commissioners Bakley, Creel and McGred by the grand jury. Indictments on similar charges were also returned against former Mayor Speer, former Chief of Police Armstrong and former Police Commissioners Hewitt, Davoren and Barton. More than 100 indictments are said to have been returned, indicating that Denver is in for a thorough cleaning up. Many of the indictments charge a score or more of persons with owning property now used for immoral purposes. A wealthy and prominent citizen is said to be among those named in the latter charge.
