WASHINGTON, Sept. 14. - In crease in the representation of organized labor in congress is the keynote of a political program to be announced tomerrow by the American Federation of Labor in a news letter. Although President Taft is roundly secred, the letter fails to indorse either Governor Wilson or Colonel Roosevelt.

The platforms of the three parties are set out in full. The republican platform is criticised, while corresponding praise is voiced for the democratic and progressive documents. The letter says the repub licans ignored the questions and principles "of justice and human iberty" affecting organized labor. President Taft, it says, has accent uated his antagonism to correction of abuse of injunction power, while Wilson and Roosevelt are outspoken ting the couple will five in Hawall, in favor of such reforms.

The bulletin also approves Sam-uel Gompers' administration of the affairs of the federations and calls upon all union laborers to elect municipal, county, state and congressional candidates favorable to organized labor.




