136,000 VOTERS NOW REGISTERED

SALEM, Ore., Sept. 16.—The total registration so far filed with the secretary of state by the various county clerks shows 136,000 names of voters.

In the primaries the republicans cast approximately 70,000 votes and the democrats approximately 18,000 votes.

The registration as shown now indicates an increase of only about 4,000 over the registration before the primaries when the registration was approximately 132,000.

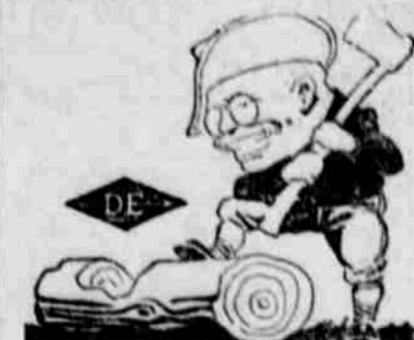
