SMALL BLAZE IN STORE DOES \$300 DAMAGE

Fire broke out last night about 11 o'clock in the store of the Southern Oregon Electrical Fixtures Supply company on Grape street, from unknown causes, but presumably from spontaneous combustion. The damage was about \$300, partially covered with insurance. Smoke and water did most of the damage. The blaze, which caused quite a smoke, started in a pile of tape, conduit wire and scraps.

The alarm was turned in just after the final curtain of "Baby Mine," and attracted a big crowd. The firemen kicked in the big plate glass in the front door to gain an entrance.
