The Glavis item of \$150 in the conservation payroll for September was held up.

Commissioners Neylan, Seavey and Humphrey of the control board refuse to explain their reason for deciding that Glavis was not entitled to pay for his work for the conservation commission, but they did not dony the sugestion that they had done this to bring the conservation Glavis' alleged activity on behalf of the Weed and West Side Lumber Companies, as charged by Surveyor General Kingsbury.


