# HALF OF FAMED NEGRO CONNECTED TWINS DEAD &

WILMINGTON, N. C., Oct. 10 .-With Millie, one of the famous negro twins, Millie-Christine, celebrated throughout the world, dead here today, the death of the other twin is expected within a few days.

The twins, born during slavery days, had the same body but two heads and two pairs of extremities. After birth they were sold for \$40,-000 for exhibition purposes, but were stolen from their owner a few years later and taken to Europe. They were highly educated and reputed to be wealthy.
