

TOO MANY PEARS IN NEW YORK

Soghol & Day under date of New York, October 5, report 63 cars Wednesday, 65 cars Thursday, 63 cars Friday, making a total of 317 cars old this week.

Pears: Heavy arrivals and sales here on fall and winter pears, and the market is lower. There was a car of California Chairegans sold yesterday, averaged \$2.00. Car and one half of Comice sold here yesterday. Californians yesterday averaged \$1.75 per half box, and a few Medford Comice \$1.50 per half box. Some few boxes sold mostly \$2.50. Several cars of Buerre Bose from Medford, half boxes averaged \$1.21, and full boxes \$2.37. Too many of this variety arriving, and the market lower daily. We sold some very handsome Seckles from Medford to average \$2.00 per half box, and some P. Barry from California averaged \$2.11 per half box. Lighter receipts on D'Anjous, but buyers well stocked up, and the last sale averaged about \$2.25 per full box. We are glad to say we have closed out the bulk of our fall and winter pears, mostly at satisfactory prices, because the outlook from now on is not very encouraging, our fanciest buyers being well filled up with the above mentioned variety.

Apples: Boxed apples in pretty heavy supply, mostly Jonathans, and a number of cars have been sold at auction. Jonathans sold yesterday on large size, from \$2.00 to \$2.25, but on 4 1/2 tiers or smaller mostly \$1.40 to \$1.60. Some Grimes Golden sold, but as already advised, not wanted, and they only averaged around \$1.25. Immense arrivals barrel apples, from 60 to 90 cars daily, and they are selling from \$2 to \$3.50, and this has its effect on the price of boxed apples.

Very warm weather here the past few days, and it is hurting the demand and cutting off the consumption of grapes and apples, and what we need is some clear, cool weather. Over 100 cars advertised for Monday.
