ORDINANCE NO. 709. An ordinance providing for the giving of additional notice to property owners to construct side walks on the street in front of their premises and providing that the city may in the event of the failure of property owners so notified to construct said walk, cause the same to be constructed and the cost thereof to be assessed against the property in front of which said side walk or sidewalks are so constructed.

Section 1. Whenever heretofore or hereafter the city council of the city of Medford shall have by resolution required the construction of any sidewalk in front of any property on any street or portion thereof, within said city in accordance with Ordinance No. 39 of said city passed and approved September 2, 1902 and when ever notice thereof has been given to such owner as provided by said ordinance and whenever the owners of property so abutting on said street or portion of said street, or any of them shall have failed to construct said sidewalk in accordance with said resolution within the period required by said resolution of said ordinance the city council of said city may direct the recorder of said city to give to the property owners, so failing to construct said sidewalk in front of their respective premises, additional notice requiring them and each of them to construct said sidewalk within ten days thereafter and notifying them that in case they fail to so construct said sidewalk within said time that the city of Medford will cause the same to be constructed and will assess the cost thereof upon the property in front of which said sidewalk is constructed, together with 10 per cent additional to cover the cost of levying and collecting said assessment.

Section 2. Said notice may be in substantially the following form: "The owner of each lot or parcel of land abutting upon (here insert the street or portion thereof) who has failed to construct a sidewalk in front of his premises on said street as required by resolution of the city council passed on the day of \_\_\_\_\_, 1912, you are hereby notified and required to construct a sidewalk in front of your lot or parcel of land fronting on the street or portion thereof, in accordance with the terms of the above mentioned resolution, and you are so required to construct said sidewalk within ten days after the date of the publication of this notice. The date of which publication is \_\_\_\_\_, 1912. And you are hereby notified that if you fail to so construct said sidewalk within said time, the city of Medford will cause said sidewalk to be constructed and will assess the cost of the portion of said sidewalk in front of your said premises against your said lot or parcel of land together with ten per cent (10 per cent) additional to cover the cost of levying and collecting said assessment. Said notice shall be given by publishing the above once in a daily newspaper published and of general circulation in said city.

Section 3. If the owner of any lot or parcel of land shall fail to construct such sidewalk in front of said lot or said street within said period of ten days, the city council may proceed to cause said work to be constructed in accordance with the original resolution ordering the same and when the cost thereof has been determined, may assess against each said lot the cost of constructing said sidewalk together with 10 per cent additional to cover the cost of levying and collecting said assessment. Said assessment shall be declared by ordinance and collected in the same manner as assessments for the improving of streets in said city providing, however, that where the assessment for constructing said sidewalk on any street or portion thereof may be so declared in one ordinance.

Section 4. This ordinance is not to be taken or held to repeal or

amend Ordinance No. 39 of said city passed and approved Sept. 2, 1902 but the same shall be taken and held to be merely supplementary thereto. ORDINANCE NO. 708. An ordinance amending Ordinance No. 695 of the city of Medford, entitled: "An ordinance providing for the grading and leveling of parking strips within the city of Medford and keeping the same free from weeds and shrubbery." The City of Medford doth ordain as follows: Section 1. That section 2 of Ordinance No. 695 of the city of Medford, entitled: "An ordinance providing for the grading and leveling of parking strips within the city of Medford and keeping the same free from weeds and shrubbery," passed by the council and approved by the mayor of said city on July 25, 1912, is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 2. In case of failure of the owner or the persons in charge of any lot or tract of land in the city of Medford, complying with the provisions of section 1, of this ordinance, it shall be the duty of the street commissioner to cause a written notice to be given to such owner or person in charge, which notice shall require such parking strip to be graded and leveled as provided in section 1, within ten days from the service of such notice. In the event of the failure of such owner or person in charge to comply with such notice within the time prescribed therein, the city council of said city may cause said parking strip to be graded and leveled, as therein provided and assess the cost thereof upon the property to which such parking strip is adjacent together with ten per cent additional to cover the cost of making such assessment and collecting the same. Such assessment shall be made, the lien thereof recorded, and collected in the same manner as assessments for street improvements in said city.
