NEW YORK WANTS ONLY BIG APPLES

Ngobel & Day write under date of New York, October 9. The arrivals here of box apples have ranged from 2 to 10 cars daily, and we have to report the market in poor shape. From 2 to 5 cars have been sold at auction here daily, and the balance have gone out through private sale. Of course the arrivals are mostly Jonathans, and they are selling at \$1.40 to \$2.00 on the 4 tier, and \$1.00 to \$1.30 on the smaller sizes. At these low prices the fruit is starting to move, and this morning there is just a little better feeling in the apple market. Some Grimes Golden have sold around \$1.00 to \$1.15. From 50 to 100 cars of barrel apples arriving here daily, and they are bringing from \$1.50 up to \$2.00 on the very finest, but mostly around \$2.25; so you see this is equal to 75 cents a box, and this is the reason why small sized fruit in boxes is selling around \$1.00 to \$1.25. We have already advised, and continue to advise our friends not to send small apples here, because they certainly will not do well; and as we are getting to the time when harder and finer apples will start to come forward, many of which will have to go into store, we say that it is simply useless to put anything but the very finest large apples in storage this season, because the small stuff will not do well at any time, we feel sure. We certainly will store no 4 1/2 and 5 tier stock. Cables in from foreign markets show Gravenstiens selling around \$1.50, and Kings at about the same price.
