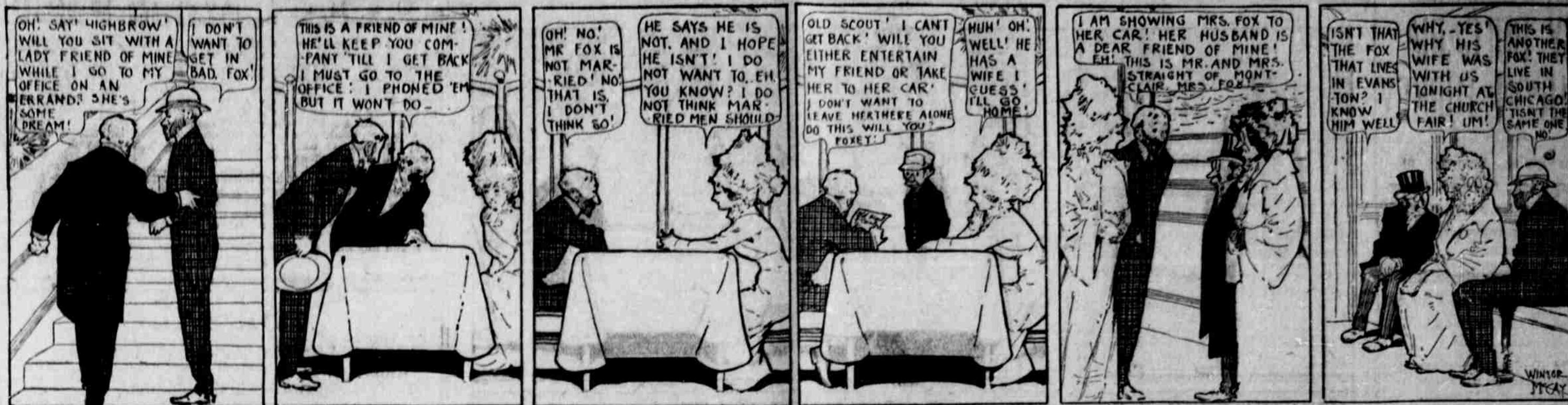


The Man from Montclair
