

WAR DECLARED BY BULGARIA UPON TURKEY

Heavy Fighting Reported Along Turko-Greek Frontier—Montenegrins Victorious in Albania—Turks Leave Coasts Without Transports.

Warships at Constantinople Held in Readiness to Sail Upon a Minute's Notice.

SOFIA, Oct. 16.—Bulgaria's declaration of war against Turkey was published here this afternoon.

BELGRADE, Oct. 16.—Bulgaria, Serbia and Greece today are drafting a joint ultimatum to Turkey, according to announcement here. It is asserted that war will be declared immediately unless the Sultan yields.

VIENNA, Oct. 16.—That the Montenegrin advance in Albania is checked was announced in a despatch received here today from Constantinople. Another despatch from Cetinje, states that the Montenegrins were victorious. The latter version is generally credited here.

Heavy fighting is reported along the Turko-Greek frontier.

Turkish ministers have left Greece, Bulgaria and Serbia without having asked for their passports.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Oct. 16.—Warships are held in readiness here today to sail on a moment's notice. Their probable destination has not been announced.

ALL EAT APPLES ON NOVEMBER 18

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 16.—The governors of all the Pacific coast states are to be asked to issue a proclamation declaring Monday, November 18, "apple day" an effort has been originated here to have everybody in the United States eat at least one apple on that day and give the entire day over to one monster celebration in honor of the northwest's greatest product. The day will mark the opening of the North West land products show in Portland, and those in charge of the show will make the effort to have the price of apples brought within the reach of all on that day at least. The celebration will be similar to California's raisin day, and housewives and hotels will be asked to serve apples in every style on "apple day."

Oregon and Washington apples will be freely distributed all along the Pacific slope in order to give the celebration impetus.

SCHRANK A DESERTER FROM GERMAN ARMY

MUNICH, Bavaria, Oct. 16.—Military authorities here today announced that John Schrank, who attempted to assassinate Colonel Theodore Roosevelt in Milwaukee Monday evening failed to serve the required enlistment in the German army before going to America. Schrank's name appears in the records here as a deserter.

ELEVEN ESCAPED CONVICTS STILL ELUDE CAPTURE

RAWLINS, Wyo., Oct. 16.—With eleven convicts who escaped from the state penitentiary here still at large, posses are today searching the hills sixty miles south of Rawlins in an effort to locate the fugitives. It is said that a feud between Governor Carey and some prominent politicians is responsible for the escape of the men. The governor accuses the politicians of having purposely exaggerated the affair in an effort to discredit him politically.

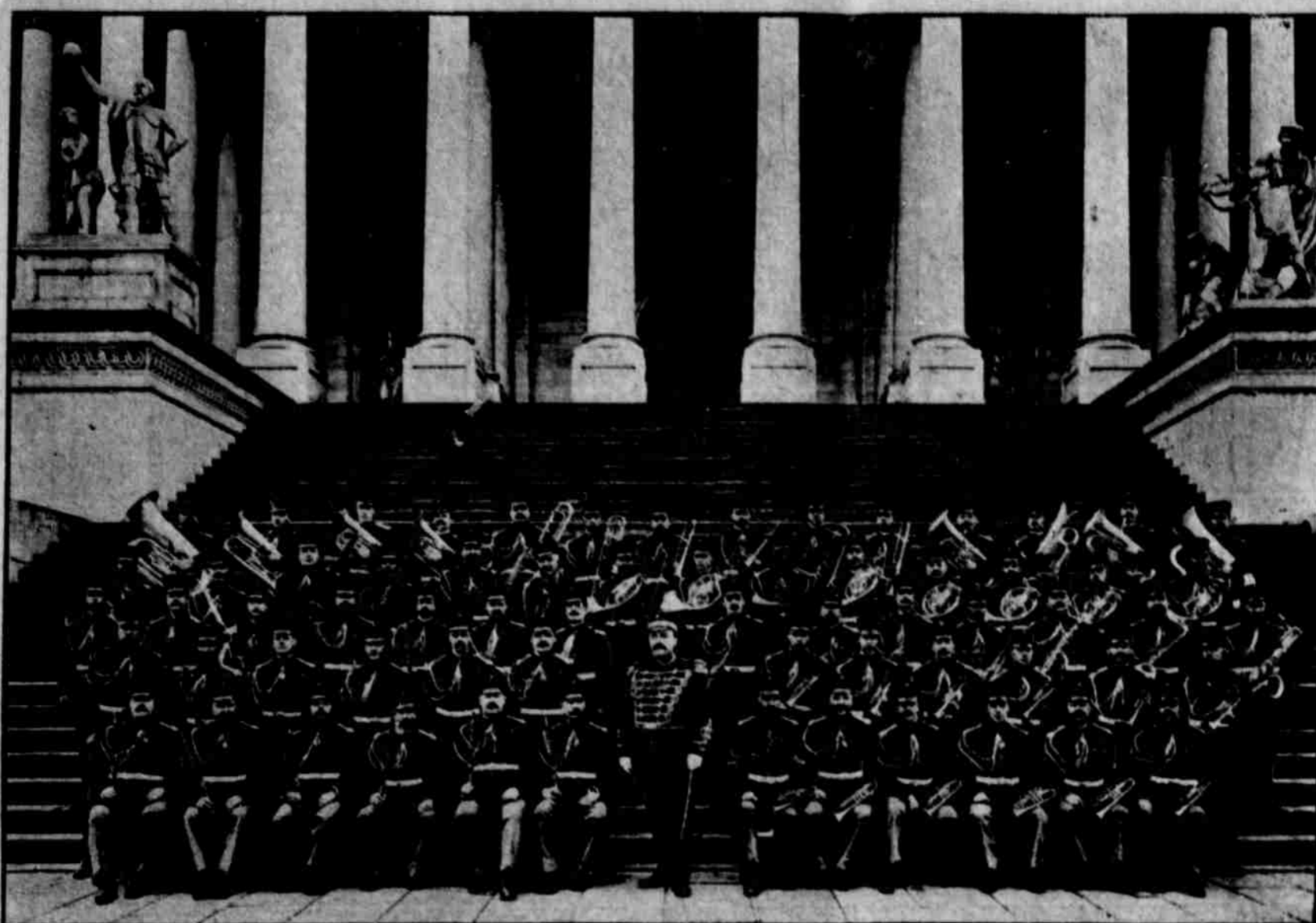
