

REAMES RETURNS SURE OF VICTORY

Clarence L. Reames, democratic nominee for joint representative from Jackson and Douglas counties, returned Saturday from Douglas county, having spent a week there during which time he made five speeches in Douglas. Mr. Reames says that he is much encouraged as the result of the trip and believes that he will receive a substantial majority in Douglas county. He will return to Roseburg early next week and devote nearly all of the time between this and election day in Douglas county, relying upon his thirty years continuous residence in Jackson county and his record here to insure him a substantial majority where he is best known.

Mr. Reames intends to make a thorough campaign in Douglas and has already covered over one hundred and fifty miles by stage. His speaking dates thus far have been at Myrtle creek, Elkton, Scottsburg, Gardiner, Drain and Yonaholm.

PARKER'S HEARING UP NEXT WEEK

GREAT REJOICING FOLLOWING DECLARATION OF WAR

ATHENS, Oct. 19.—The foreign minister at a sitting of the chamber of deputies announced today that Greece had declared war against Turkey. He added that up to the last minute Turkey had made all kinds of efforts and held out all sorts of promises to have Greece break away from the Balkan confederation.

The premier read messages from King George in which his majesty said the suffering of his oppressed brethren in the Balkan states forced recourse to arms.

He also read a telegram from the crown prince reporting the Greek army had entered Turkish territory. Amid cheering the president of the chamber asked permission to send greetings to the allies now that the cannon are roaring in the name of civilization and Christianity against barbarism.
