

ONLY PEARS LEFT ARE EASTER BUIERRE

SACRAMENTO, Cal., Oct. 20.—The following gives number of cars of deciduous fruit shipped from all points in California for the week (7 days) ending Friday evening, October 18th, 1912.

Pears: 31 cars. Very little in the line of winter pears now remain in the state except Easter Buerre. These pears are exceptionally good this year, being of fine size, and, owing to the long, dry fall, unusually well ripened.

Weather during the past week has been good. At the time this letter is being written the sky is overcast with clouds and rain is threatened.

CATTLE MARKET HOLDS STRENGTH

PORTLAND, Oct. 21.—Receipts for the week were 1262 cattle, 73 calves, 3633 hogs, 5880 sheep and 26 horses.

There was some little difference of opinion among buyers and sellers as to whether or not the cattle market was as high this week as any time during the fall.

The hog market was strong to the higher this week. Buyers stated that the advance in price was due to the extreme quality of the offering.

The sheep market was fairly strong throughout.

GRAVE CREEK WATER FOR GRANTS PASS

GRANTS PASS, Oct. 21.—That the Grave creek water proposition is a feasible one is the report made by Engineers Hobson and Hall, who recently made investigation of the sources of the water supply, and the engineering features involved in bringing the water to Grants Pass.

The engineers decided that a point on Grace creek, in section 6 of township 34, in Jackson county, offered the most available site for damming the creek, and that the drainage area lies within that portion of the Rogue mountains along the divide between that stream and the headwaters of tributaries of the South Umpqua.

The plan advanced includes the construction of the dam, the building of ditch and pipe lines, or irrigation canals, and subsequently of the development of electricity for light and power.

COOPERATION CREAMERY AT APPLEGATE PROFITABLE

The Valley Pride creamery, a cooperative institution in the Applegate made during the first half of the present month 4000 pounds of butter, for which it finds ready market at 70 cents per two pound roll.

How profitable the farmers of the Applegate are finding the dairy industry is proven by the experience of Pitcock Bros., who have a farm on Humburg creek. From seven cows that are run as a side issue to the other farming operations butter fat amounting to \$91.35 was sold during the past month.
