

JACKSON COUNTY PIONEER DEAD

William Thomas Burnett, a pioneer of Jackson county, died at his home near Talent Thursday, October 24, 1912, aged 72 years, 11 months and 30 days.

Deceased was a native of Ohio and came to Jackson county 37 years ago and took up a homestead on Griffin creek. He afterwards moved to a place west from Phoenix, where he set out one of the first peach orchards ever planted in the valley, the property now being the Calhoun place. He was a soldier in the union army, having served three years in the Fourth Ohio volunteer regiment. Besides a wife deceased leaves four sons, J. S. Burnett, of Ashland, G. W. W. F. and H. C. Burnett, all living near Talent.

BIG STRIKE SOON CANADIAN PACIFIC

OTTAWA, Ont., Oct. 25.—A statement issued by Mr. R. A. Mosher, president of the Canadian Brotherhood of Railway Employees, indicates the probability of a serious strike on the Canadian Pacific system. The organization represented by Mr. Mosher comprises five thousand employees, including freight handlers, freight clerks, office clerks and employees of the clerical and baggage departments of the Canadian Pacific. In the statement it is claimed that the organization has for the past six months been negotiating with the company and with the department of labor with a view to obtaining higher pay and overtime, but so far without avail.
