**DEMOCRATIC FUNDS FOR CAMPAIGN \$680,000**

WASHINGTON, Oct. 26.—Contributions to the presidential campaign fund of the democratic party this year will total \$680,000, according to the sworn statement by Treasurer Wells filed today with the clerk of the house of representatives. The expenditures aggregate \$562,000, made and outstanding obligations amount to \$55,000.  
 All told, 56,303 contributions were received.  
 Of these, over 52,000 were in amounts of less than \$100. Wilson himself gave \$500. Herman Rider as chairman of the national committee, turned over more than \$28,000 as surplus of the Baltimore convention. Justice Gerard gave \$13,000, Charles R. Crane and Jacob H. Schiff each \$10,000, as did Samuel Untermyer, Frederick C. Penfield, Henry Goldman and Henry Morganthau. Dr. J. B. Murphy of Chicago, who recently attended Roosevelt in that city, gave \$100.

**CUBANS ARE STIRRED BY ELECTIONS**

WASHINGTON, Oct. 26.—A serious situation in Cuba is demonstrated by last night's riot in Havana, causing a grave solitudine to the United States government. Reports indicate there are grounds that have existed here for some time that the approaching election in Cuba will be a critical test of the stability of the republic.  
 Between now and Friday, election day, many political meetings are to be held, with every indication there will be clashes between the two principal parties. Should the conditions assume a seriousness sufficient to warrant, the United States has available for immediate dispatch to Cuba 15,000 men to take charge of the conditions.
