SACRAMENTO, Oct. 26.—The following gives number of cars of deciduous fruit shipped from all points in California for the week (7 days), ending Friday evening, Oct. 25, 1912: Pears: 14 cars. The pear movement is now nearing its end. There will be very few more cars of this variety to go, with the exception of scattering lots from the Santa Clara district.

Weather during the past week has been adverse to shipping. Light showers fell on the 22nd and again on the 25th. They will have no other effect than to interfere with the cleaning up of the Tokay crop. At this writing the weather is pleasant and bids fair to remain so for several days.

of Music here last night paid a tribute to Governor Wilson. The meeting was arranged and held under the auspices of the League of Independent Republicans. Gilbert F. Roe, brother-in-law of Senator La Follette, and Rudolph Spreckles of California preceded Wilson with speeches in his favor.

Governor Wilson in a speech said the only question before the country was whether the people trust the men who are now leading the democratic party or whether they considered them vague visionaries and radical reformers. The governor declared when interrupted with cries of "How about Roosevelt?" that he denied himself the pleasure of discussing Roosevelt this week.
