

## SAY WOLGAST DODGING FIGHT

NEW ORLEANS, La., Oct. 31.—Flat charges that Ad Wolgast, lightweight champion of the world, is trying to "crawl out" of his ten round match here Monday with Joe Mandot, conqueror of Joe Rivers of Los Angeles, were freely made today by Mandot's friends.

Wolgast, the supporters of Mandot assert, realizes that he has "gone back," and fearing that Mandot will relieve him of his title, is trying to sidestep the match by refusing to accept any referee that the club managers have named.

Wolgast now insists on naming the referee, although Tom Jones, his manager, accepted Tommy Walsh, who also was satisfactory to Mandot. Wolgast also objects to Dr. Barnes, the club's official referee. Mandot, it is said, will let Wolgast have his own way in the selection of the referee, with the intention of trying hard for a knockout when they enter the ring.

## PORTLAND'S CHANCE TO SECURE STEAMER

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 31.—Due to the activity of the chamber of commerce in collecting a fund to be used as a guaranty against loss for any line putting Portland in touch with the Oriental markets, the Hamburg-American line has made a formal offer by telegraph to designate Portland as the Pacific Coast terminus of its "around-the-world" service. The fleet touching here would be made up of 10,000 ton steamers carrying both passengers and freight. The German concern promises to care not only for the trans-Pacific trade, but will carry Oregon and northwest goods to all of its other ports.

If the company's offer is disregarded the Pacific Coast port will probably be made at Seattle.

It is expected that San Francisco will also bid.

## TURKS MASSACRE EVERY FOREIGNER

VRANJE, Oct. 31.—A massacre of foreigners in Turkey is imminent, according to reliable reports here today. Turks taken captive by the Serbian troops declare that if reverse continue, no Christian will be safe in the Ottoman empire.

G. O. Taylor, the republican candidate for this office is the junior partner of the law firm of Carkin & Taylor of this city.

This provision of the code which provides that no justice of the peace shall have a partner who shall practice law or act as attorney in his court, is a law of the people and should be observed by the justice of the peace, as well as any other law, and in spirit and letter as well.

If I am elected to the office of Justice of the Peace, I promise the people of Medford district that I will conduct this office in accordance with the law, and that I will not have, nor will I permit any partner of mine, to appear in, as attorney, or to bring any suit or other action, in my court, as has been done in the Justice Court of this district during the last administration.

## ACCUSED MURDERERS CAUGHT IN OHIO

LIMA, Ohio, Oct. 31.—Suspected by the police of complicity in the murder of Miss Sophie Singer a Baltimore heiress, in a Chicago rooming house, Charles Conway, a professional high diver, and his wife, were arrested here today. The couple were taken into custody at the home of Conway's mother, Mrs. Joseph Cramer.

Charles Worthen, formerly a street car conductor in Baltimore, who was to have married Miss Singer on the day following the murder, told the Chicago police that robbery was the motive for the crime. More than \$1,000 in jewelry and \$45 cash was missing when Miss Singer's body was found, wrapped in bedclothing in Conway's room. A doorknob, improvised into a "billy," was the instrument of death.

SAN ANTONIO, Texas, Oct. 31.—Revised lists, compiled today, of the dead and injured as a result of the destruction yesterday of St. John's Orphan asylum here show that nine persons perished in the fire—six Sisters of Charity and three children.

The funerals of the victims were held today, and a requiem high mass sung for them.

Arrangements are under way for the rebuilding of the orphanage and the erection of a memorial to those who lost their lives in saving the inmates.

## SOLDIER SHOTS MEXICAN SENORITA

NOGALES, Ariz., Oct. 31.—Mexican rurales are searching the country south of the border today for a private of Troop D, United States cavalry, who shot and killed Senorita Garcia, 22, daughter of a Southern Pacific section foreman here, at midnight.

The soldier, who it is said, was repulsed by the girl, fired two shots into her body, killing her instantly. His name has not yet been learned.

Two Mexicans interfered in an effort to save the girl. The infuriated soldier, crazed by drink, shot them down. They will recover. He then stole a horse and fled into Mexican territory.
