SIXTEEN PERISH ON LAKE STEAMER

MONTREAL, Que., Nov. 2.—Sixteen men, women and children perished in Lake St. Louise at Isle Perrot, ten miles west of here, when the Steamer Cecile, a little vessel plying between Montreal and Valbyfield, sank early today in a terrific storm. Four passengers—all men—were saved.

The storm struck the vessel just as it was entering the lake, the crew losing all control of the craft. The Cecile was quickly driven on the rocks by a forty-five mile gale, her wooden hull being smashed to fragments and the passengers thrown into the water.

AFTER CANDIDATES FOR EXPENDITURES

SALEM, Ore., Nov. 2.—Governor West, upon the advice of Attorney Moulter of Portland today directed Attorney General Crawford to proceed against all candidates for offices in the state alleged to have violated the corrupt practices act.

Moulter declares that two prominent candidates for United States senator, giving no names, have spent in the aggregate over \$75,000 in the interests of their campaigns.

According to the corrupt practices act no candidate can spend over 15 per cent of the annual salary of the office for which he aspires, making, therefore, the campaign expenditures in seeking the United States senatorship something like \$1100.

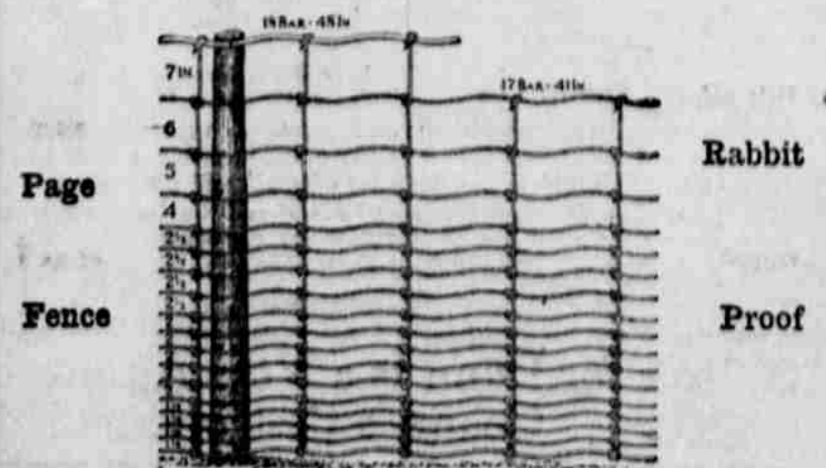
