TAFTITES TO VOTE FOR WILSON AS TAFT IS THIRD

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 5.—Taft leaders here have ceased their efforts in behalf of President Taft, realizing that it is hopeless to expect better than third place for their leader in Oregon.

The Oregonian, which has from the first been a consistent supporter of President Taft's candidacy, has editorially admitted the utter hopelessness of his cause. This is but an echo of the sentiment which has been growing for the past three weeks, states frankly that should all of President Taft's supporters in Oregon vote for him he could not carry the state.

Wilson will carry Multnomah county by a good plurality, in the opinion of those who have studied and canvassed the situation carefully. Reports received from over the state lead to the belief that the New Jersey governor will carry the state. This is the belief of men who have long been closely identified with Oregon politics, and have been, and are now Taft men.

The most significant thing in this closing week of the campaign, is not the rapid crystallization of Wilson sentiment and support, but the outspoken and increasingly numerous commendations of Wilson's candidacy by men who, up to this time, have been active Taft supporters.
