The Medford National bank is in receipt of a letter from the Wells for the office of coroner of Jackson Fargo National bank of fan Fran- county, on the independent ticket. cisco in which a consular report is quoted. It is published for the benefit of local apple growers. The letter follows:

"In the Daily Consular and Trade Reports of October 18th, 1912, we notice the following:

'No. 9727. Applea. An American consular officer reports that owing to the short apple crop this year in a foreign country a splendid opportunity is offered American growers and shippers. Apples have been and are now being imported from other countries, including the United States. Imports of American apples in 1910 amounted to \$80,000 and in 1911 to \$61,000. This year, in the opinion of the consular officer, a little effort on the part of exporters should double these amounts, as American apples are considered auperior to all others and are in constant demand. A list of commission agents and wholesale dealers to whom exporters should write accompanied the report, and can be obtained upon application to the Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Com-

merce. "We bring this to your attention with the idea that it may interest you; if it does, application for further information should be sent to the Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce, Department of Commerce and Labor, Washington, D. C., quoting file number as above."
