SUCCESSFUL TRAP SEASON

IN UNITED STATES CLOSES

One of the most successful trap shooting seasons in the history of the game in America has reached its end from 100 to 200. with the 1910 professional record, .9775 per cent., based on an aggregate season's score of 1,955 out of 2,000, made by William H. Heer, with Remington-UMC speed shells, still unbeaten. George W. Maxwell, the one-armed Remington-UMC professional shooter, finished with the remarkable average of .9655 per cent., having broken 1,931 out of 2,000. Mr. Heer, always in the first division, completed the year with .9650 per eent., having broken 1,930 of his 2,000 targets. Three shooters Remington-UMC ammunition top the official list of amateur averages at singles; William Ridley, 767x800, 9587 per cent.; Roy H. Bruns, 766x 800, .9575 per cent.; and George J. LANDSLIDE FOR **WOODROW WILSON** THROUGH NATION

NEW YORK, Nov. 8 .- Woodrow Wilson, democrat, swept the country vesterday.

Returns early today showed that he predictions that the democratic party would be put in control in the nation were well founded. A popular as well as electoral plurality was insured for Wilson by a united party in every state of the union. He carried 32 states with a total vote in the electoral college of 354 out of 451 votes. He carried his own state

of New Jersey. He wrested from President Taft his native state of Ohio and from Colonel Roosevelt his home commonwealth of New York. since the organization of the republican party a democrat will get the electoral vote of Maine,

Wilson goes into office with a heavy congress behind him and assurances that the next senate will be made up of his party faith. He will be able to force through the measures to which he is pledged.

Wilson carried with him to victory democratic senators and congressmen everywhere. He earried through enough members of legislatures to insure the retirement of Senator Briggs to private life and the elevation to the senate of former Congressman William Hughes, in whose behalf Wilson stumped the state during the last few days.
