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CHICAGO, Nov. 8 .- That the government has sufficient evidence to try Jack Johnson, negro pugilist on eight separate charges involving his relations with white girls, is the authoritative report here today.

The government prosecutors declare they can prove Johnson supported a harem in a Wabash avenue house, which he rented for that purpose. Belle Schreiber, they said. was his favorite among four white girls he kept there.

Johnson appeared in Judge Landia' court accompanied by six black friends, his white valet and his secretary, Joseph Levy, and asked that his \$30,000 bond be lowered.

"Your honor, I'm here as I promlaed and I would like to have my bond reduced," said Johnson.

Judge Laudis refused to consider the matter until the negro's attorney appeared. Johnson sat down in the court room to wait and fell asleep. He was awakened by his attorney. The case finally went over.




