





> District Attorney Zabel this atternoon received an envelope from Schrank inscribed as follows:

> "Complimentary. The contents are poems written in the county jail by John Schrank, the assassin."

> Schrank refers to himself in his writings as "first in war, first in peace, first aainst a third term." The concluding line of one of his poems, "Life of Sin. ' reads:

> "Let us live out this life, we're a long time dead."
