SAYS STRANGER

Harry Horrowitz Denies That He or Other Three Gunmen Shot Rosenthal, But Admits That He Was Near Scene of Crime at Time.

Did Not Know Gambler Was Dead Until He Read About It in the Papers Next Day.

NEW YORK, Nov. 14 .- Taking the stand in his own behalf, Harry Horrowitz, alias "Gyp the Blood," on trial here, with three other ganmen for the alleged actual killing of Gambler Herman Rosenthal, denied today that he or any of the other defendants shot Rosenthal. The witness admitted that he was near the scene of the crime, but insisted that "strange" man did the shooting.

Horrowitz declared that he and the other defendants met the stranger earlier in the day at a bridge whist game in "Bridgey" Webber's poker rooms. The shooting of Rosenthal, he said, was sudden, with Webber and Harry Vallon joining in the fusilade. The witness said he met Webber, Vailon, Rose, Sam Schepps and the stranger only a short time before the shooting.
