TROOPS READY TO

First Move Would Mean Attack on Austria by Russia-Friction Between Balkan Allies Has Disappeared-Conference at Berlin.

LONDON, Dec. 3 .- While Turkey and the Balkan allies still hesitate on the brink of an armistice today with a growing probability that no agreement will be reached, British diplomats are far more gravely concerned over the increasing danger that Europe is to be involved in war over a division of the spoils to be reft from the sultan.

IS NOT A MOTHER


