Miss Letta Luke of Talent, age 24 years, postmistress at that place, is the first woman in the state to be officially elected to a municipal position since suffrage obtained in Oregon. At the city election held on Tuesday her townpeople gave her a majority of 28 out of 91 votes cast for the office of city recorder. Thirty-three women voted.

NOTE OF WARNING IN TAFT'S MESSAGE
