MRS. PAYNE WHITNEY SULZER PLEADS FOR LEGISLATION TO AID HUMANITY

ALBANY, N. Y., Jan. 2. - Abolition of child labor and the safeguardinof the lives of the workingmen and women were the dominant notes in the first message sent to the New York state legislature by Governor William Sulzer, who today assumed office. "Human life is infinitely sore valuable than the profit of material things," declared Sulzer, and he demanded legislation that will end the canvery and other child labor scandals; compel the use of safety appliances in all branches of emfleved to be sufficiently strong to with- ployment and a real workingman's mpensation act.

Sulzer declared for the immediate submission of the question of women's suffrage to the people; ratification of the constitutional amendment providing for the direct election of United States senators by the peo-ple; sweeping economy in public office and the abolition of all useless offices; comprehensive electoral reform which will provide for direct primaries, and sweeping conservation of natural resources.
