COUNCIL TO PASS ON TROLLEY LINE FRANCHISE TUESDAY

The city council met as a committee of the whole Thursday night for the purpose of considering two applications for a street trolley line franchise, one from the M. P. Minney company and the other from W. S. Barnum.

Great interest was displayed by citizens in the matter the council chamber being jammed with a curious throng.

A number of changes were made in the franchise. W. I. Vawter appeared for the company and met all of the requests of the city.

Section 1 provides for the construction of the road and defines its rights and obligations. It also provides that unless the actual construction work is started within ninety days the ordinance is void.

Section 2. Defines the rights as to motive power to be used and as to yards and switches.

Section 3. Provides for the construction, material, etc., to be used.

Section 4. Provides for the conformity to grade and the care of the streets used.

Section 5. Transmission of power and communication is granted in connection with the operation of the road.

Section 6. Maintenance of street during and after construction work.

Section 7. City business shall not be hindered.

Section 8. A 5-cent fare with transfer within the city limits is provided.

Section 9. The franchise shall run for a term of fifty years.

Section 10. Binding the heirs and assigns to the provisions.

Section 11. Forfeiture in event of a failure to operate the lines.

Section 12. Acceptance of franchise within fifteen days; forfeiture of \$2500 in event of failure to comply with ordinance.

MORGAN THE GREAT.

THE testimony of J. P. Morgan before the money trust probers was a skein of conventional lies quite in keeping with his character—for Morgan is a master hypocrite as well as a money king.

Morgan's word is as good as his bond, but he doesn't hesitate to cause untold misery or bring on a panic by giving the word.

Morgan gives immense sums to charity but does more to produce misery and pauperism than anyone in the nation, because his power is greater.

Morgan is a pillar of the church, but between conferences chases around Europe with actresses for whom he builds beautiful theatres.

Morgan is a patriot. He saved the nation by a bond deal made with Grover Cleveland whereby he pocketed many millions at Uncle Sam's loss. He again saved it under Roosevelt by loaning the government's money at a personal profit to stay the panic he himself had brought on.

Morgan is a great financier—he has tremendously increased the price of living by creating monopolies and inflating securities and making the people buy them and pay interest on them. He has grabbed control of the wages, savings and industries of the people and made them a football to be kicked about by speculators and gamblers.

Morgan knows all about finance—but he didn't impart any of his knowledge at the congressional hearing. He took six lawyers to Washington to coach him on withholding information from the people. It won't bear the light. His patriotism consists in milking the nation.

COUNTY AUDITOR NEEDED.

EVERY large business that handles much money requires an auditor to check over and audit accounts and cash. Experience has proved the value of such an official.

Nowhere is an auditor's service required more than in county court houses, where millions of dollars of the people's money are handled during the terms of officeholders. Public officials, though they may be and generally are honest, are elected because of popularity and are seldom expert accountants or familiar with the intricacies of bookkeeping. An auditor should be there to check over books regularly and devise new, simpler and more satisfactory systems, to detect and prevent errors from creeping in and to expose dishonesty or defalcation.

An auditorship should not be an elective office, but appointive. The county court, responsible for the conduct of the officials, should have the appointive power. The cost would not be much higher to the county than the periodic expiring by high priced auditors.

It is probable that the court already has ample powers to appoint an auditor for Jackson county. If not, such authorization should be secured from the legislature, for an auditor is badly needed.

It is to be hoped that the new county court will inaugurate business methods by employing an auditor for county records as well as by needed reforms in bookkeeping and cash-keeping methods. Pledged to a business regime, it cannot well do otherwise.

TAILOR CAUGHT STEALING WITH GOODS ON HIM

Caught with the goods on him by some clever work on the part of Harry Cingrade of the Medford police force, Frank W. McKay, who has been employed as a tailor by W. F. Isaacs during the past year, made a complete confession to Teggery Bill Thursday night that he had been carrying clothes from the Teggery for the past year and selling them on Whiskey row. Mr. Isaacs declined to prosecute providing that McKay left town which he did, after refunding to Mr. Isaacs a portion of the money he has received through his illicit dealings.

Some time ago Officer Cingrade became suspicious of the manner in which McKay was acting and decided to watch him. On Thursday evening with a bundle under his arm McKay entered a front street saloon. Calling a friend as a witness Cingrade followed him and found in the package a new suit of clothes. Teggery Bill's marks were on the clothes and he identified the clothes as his property.

McKay admitted his guilt and on account of his family plead for clemency. Mr. Isaacs agreed not to prosecute providing McKay would leave town at once which he did.

McKay admitted taking 10 or 12 suits aside from a bunch of underwear, sweaters and the like. Officer Cingrade is of the belief that the goods stolen amount to several hundred dollars.
