FRUIT GROWERS FORM EXCHANGE

The Rogue River Co-operative Fruit Growers' association was formed at a meeting of a number of interested growers held Saturday afternoon.
J. A. Perry was elected chairman and S. A. Nye was elected secretary. The first speaker, C. C. George, extolled the co-operative plan and gave as his opinion that the present Rogue River Fruit & Produce association is on the wrong track in selling and moreover does not cooperate with the majority of the growers. He said that the condition and the sale of fruit should be the care of the association while it was still upon the trees. That our pears and apples are unsurpassed, but that the middle western markets never see any of it, and that finally the sale of our fruit should be regulated and the cost of production cut down.

THE TROLLEY FRANCHISE

IN the consideration of franchises, the city council should bear in mind that the development of the adjacent country by an interurban trolley is more to be desired than the building of electric lines within city limits, which while a convenience to the people, do not mean much to the prosperity of the community.
From a development point of view, each mile of operated railroad outside the city is worth more to the city than two miles within. It is the interurban feature that is the developer, not the lines within the city.
The Barnum application means the electrizing of the Jacksonville line and its extension through the city and its operation along lines made famous by Barnum. It means no new territory opened and developed, and cannot, in the nature of things give much of a stimulus to the development of the county.
The Minney proposal, on the other hand, means the opening up of a new section of the country, is built primarily to develop the land traversed, and is the first link in an interurban belt line that will eventually encircle the valley. Backed by a successful company whose chief business is land development, it should mean new people, new money, new enterprises and new payrolls.
For those who have the future of the city as well as country at heart, there seems only one thing to do, and that is secure an up-to-date trolley system while we have the chance.

Why Talent Is Growing
