GRANTS PASS IS **BUILDING RAILROAD** WITH CITY FUNDS

GRANTS PASS, Feb. 4 -- At the meeting of the council a special fund to be known as the railroad and coustruction fund was ereated, and the treasurer was instructed to transfer \$2,500 from the general fund to the

A second resolution directs that all hills and claims on account of the expense of building the municipal railroad from Grants Pass south to the Applegate river now or hereafter incurred shall be referred to the public utility commission

Up to February 1st all hills for al departments of the P.-I. work amounted to \$1,738.07, vonchers for which are in the hands of the com mission. The engineering depart ment since the office was first opened has contracted bills amounting to \$527.55, this figure including the office and field expense. For clearing right of way and all other items coming under the head of the grading account, bills for \$1.191.79 are vouchered, while for printed sup-plies, etc., \$18.75 is charged.

From 15 to 18 men are employed on clearing the right of way, the pay roll to date amounting to \$858.48. To show for this expenditure, 24 acres of right-of-way have been eleared, including that portion from station 81 to station 230. The workmen are now just across the Jerome Prairie


