

PRIZE WINNERS IN GOOD HEALTH SCHOOL CENTERS

As an incentive to induce children to begin early to care for their teeth, each child attending school in the southern part of Jackson county was presented with a tube of dental cream and a pledge card containing instructions for brushing and cleaning the teeth. Fifteen prizes, consisting of dental cream and other toilet preparations, were offered for the best essays written on "Care of the Teeth." Children were requested to observe these rules:

1. Subject, "Care of the Teeth."
2. The essays must be written in ink upon one side of paper only.
3. They must be original, not more than 300 words in length, and the one writing them shall write on the back of his essay the following information:

"Care of the Teeth," name and grade of pupil writing the essay, number of school he or she attend.

4. Not more than two first prizes shall go to any one school.
5. In awarding prizes, the grade of the pupil as well as the substance of the composition, neatness, legibility, etc., shall be taken into consideration.
6. The essays from any one school should be sent in one package, and they must reach this office not later than February 1, 1913.

Many of the essays brought out the statement that the essential thing in caring for the teeth was a good tooth brush and one or more of such materials as lukewarm water, soap, salt, glycothymoline, charcoal, peroxide of hydrogen, tooth powder or paste, listerine, etc., and that when one began the practice of using them, the habit would do the rest.

The essay given below was written by Laura F. Joy, a fifth grade girl in District 29, near Medford:

Care of the Teeth

It is very important that we should know how to take care of the teeth. They help us in many ways all through life and that is why we should know what nature has given them to us for. The teeth have work to do as much as other parts of the body. Their work is to grind up the food fine so it can be easily digested.

We clean the teeth to keep them from decaying. Clean teeth also add to the appearance and make one look much better.

When cleaning the teeth we must be careful not to employ the tooth brush so vigorously as to cause the gums to bleed, because this does harm. The tooth brush should be used at least twice a day—in the morning directly after breakfast and in the evening before going to bed.

The teeth require very little to keep them clean. Lukewarm water should be used, if salt water is used it will be all the better. If good powder cannot be secured white castile soap will answer very well.

The teeth should be examined twice a year by a good dentist and any cavities promptly filled.

Mme. Nordica Here Next Friday Evening



Mme. Lillian Nordica, who will be heard in concert here on Friday evening, Feb. 14th, made her operatic debut as "Violetta" the hapless heroine of La Traviata in Brescia, Italy.

This was followed by a train of similar successes in other cities, including Milan and Genoa. Her fame spread rapidly all over the European continent from the sunny southland of song to London, and on to the exacting censors of the great northern capital, St. Petersburg. One season there was followed by an immediate re-engagement for another, a distinction of unusual occurrence and easily stamping the singer as a great prima donna. Thence to London, to Paris and in 1894 to be awarded at the invitation of Mme. Cosima Wagner, to create the role of "Elsa" in Lohengrin at Bayreuth. Internationally famous, Nordica was about to accomplish the greatest of her artistic triumphs thus far in being accorded the honor of being the first "Isolde" and "Elsa" to be heard at the Prinz-Regenten theater in Munich.

In 1895, she effected what was virtually a renaissance of Wagner in this country, and the memorable November night of that year when she sang "Isolde" at the Metropolitan Opera House, will never be forgotten. The famous diamond tiara presented to her on that occasion and which was a voluntary contribution from her admirers all over the country, is a significant memento of her artistic success.
