Before the senators submitted their demand to Madero, they submitted a statement to the public which is arousing the greatest excitement.

Members of the senate committee declared that the British minister had received a cable from President Taft advising that American troops now are enroute to the Mexican border and that it was Taft's opinion that intervention is inevitable.

The resolution if passed would become operative if the strike lasts over a week. It provides that if the strikers are
