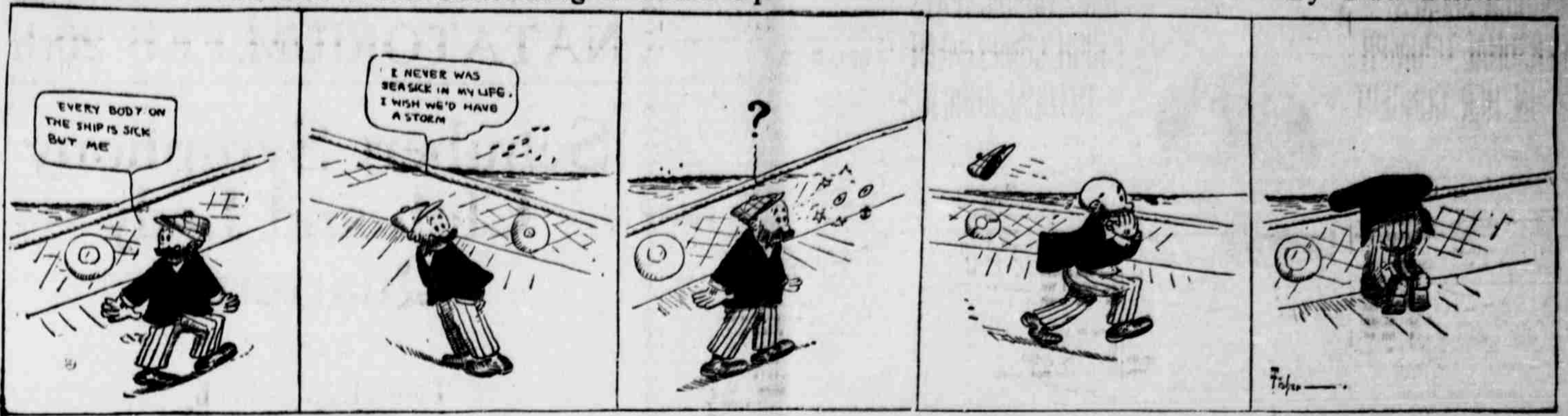


You Never Can Tell When Something 'll Come Up
