NORDICA SCORES IN HER CONCERT

Madame Lillian Nordica, the third metropolitan grand opera star to sing in Medford this season, scored a warm personal triumph in Medford Friday evening. In many respects her's was the most enjoyable concert of the three.

Nordica is more dramatic than Schumann-Heink, though not so human, and is much more sympathetic and pleasing than Gadski. Seldom is an opera star of her magnitude so gracious in concert and seldom is she so successful in a pro gram as varied as was Friday even-

Her Fine Accompanist Romayne Simmons, who has accompanied Nordica for years, suits the plane to her voice in ideal manner. His accompaniment to the Eriking varies so much from the escussion in local musical circles.


